<u>CLIL LESSON – MUSIC</u> Lesson plan 2

Lesson theme: Ludwig van Beethoven and a part of his life School Subject: Music Grade: 7. - 8.

Content Objective: to inform pupils about Beethoven's life.

Language Objective: to practice reading, undrestanding of written text

1. Starter- introduction:

Brainstorming - talking in a group:

What do you know about Ludwig van Beethoven? When did he live ? Where does he come from ? Do you know who is the the author of the European anthem ?

2. Reading - text about Ludwig van Beethoven's life.

Pupils will be divided into 5 groups and each group will get one part of a text about Beethoven's life in English and translate it to Czech or different mother language. They can use dictionary or e-dictionary. After reading they will write translation of words from the box:

Ludwig van Beethoven - The Early Years

Ludwig Van Beethoven, one of the most famoust composers of classical music and author of nine symphonies, was born in **Bonn in Germany in 1770**. His dad and grandpa were both talented musicians. Beethoven gave his first public performance (playing the piano) when he was seven and had his first piece of music published by the time he was **12 years old**.

Ludwig van Beethoven meets Mozart music

When Beethoven was 17 he went to **Vienna**. In 1787 Beethoven made his first visit to Vienna, where he stayed for about two weeks and may have met Mozart, or at least heard him play. Beethoven's trip was cut short when he found out his **mother was dying**. He quickly returned home. Five years later Beethoven went back to Vienna to live.

Ludwig van Beethoven - The Quiet Years

When Beethoven was 28 years old, he noticed his **hearing was going**. He was very upset by this - so much so that he thought of ending his life. Beethoven's **social life** was affected the most. As his hearing became worse, Beethoven went into seclusion from both the public and his friends. Eventually, he was left **completely deaf**.

Ludwig van Beethoven - The Final Years

Being hearing impaired didn't stop Beethoven from **writing music** but life wasn't easy for him. Beethoven was seriously ill. He moved more than 52 times during his final years. When the famous composer died at the age of 56, almost **30,000 people** attended his funeral. Unlike some other composers of that time, Beethoven enjoyed recognition before his death.
