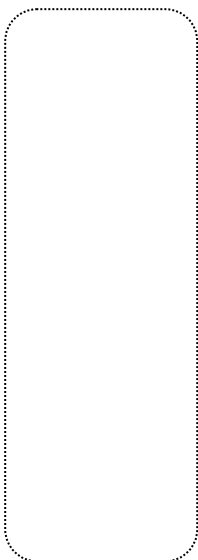

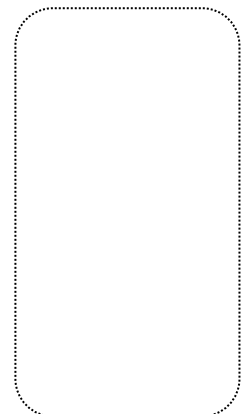
... typically placed immediately to the front side and above the level of the stage. They are often separate rooms with an open viewing area which typically seat four people or less ...
